July 15th, 2022 – July 21st, 2022

Evenin' Muskego! I'm a little late with last week's news, but it's news none the less. I hope everyone had a great weekend and didn't get blown/washed away in the storms. I want to give a special shout out to the Muskego Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association and thank them for the amazing pig roast they hosted for us on Saturday afternoon/evening. We're truly blessed as a department to have such a wonderful group of caring individuals that donate their free time towards doing nice things for our officers and dispatchers. So, thank you! With that said, let's get started.

July 15th:

- 8:40 a.m. – A 62 year old resident of the S8600 block of Cottage Circle West was arrested for possessing moon cabbage paraphernalia. The arrest occurred in the parking lot of Park Arthur after an officer happened upon our arrestee's vehicle, which was parked in a stall designated for vehicles with trailers only. Due to his admission of having recently smoked, he was released to a sober party following his citation issuance and on scene release.
- 11:23 a.m. – A 78 year old resident of the S6600 block of Spring Lane responded to the police department to report while hosting a rummage sale at his residence, an unknown subject had shown up and attempted selling firearms and ammunition to several folks also in attendance. While strange, no state statutes or municipal ordinance violations were determined to have occurred. July 16th:

July 19th:

An officer was summoned and investigation revealed the messages were coming from Jr.'s girlfriend's ex. Likely story. An extra patrol was placed on their residence and I'd guess the officer will be following up with the ex.

- 6:58 p.m. – Officers responded to a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. after an employee called to report a disorderly patron. According to witnesses, a white, male subject, approximately 30-40 years of age wearing jean shorts and a New Berlin Fire Department T-shirt became upset when approached by an employee at the check out counter, yelling at the cashier and threatening to “shoot up the store”. The suspect was last seen leaving the parking lot in a newer model Buick sedan. Unfortunately, responding officers were unable to locate him. Investigation continuing.

We located the operator, a 49 year old Milwaukeean, who was subsequently arrested on five counts of bail jumping, resisting/obstructing, theft of a motor vehicle, receiving stolen property, a parole violation, and a partridge in a pear tree.
