## Music Makers

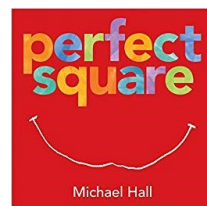

## 500 Books Before 15

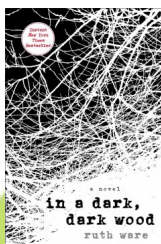

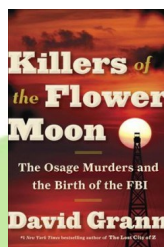

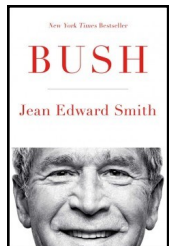
