Meeting Minutes for March 5, 2019

Call to Order:

Call to order: Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm at the Muskego City Hall.

Pledge of Allegiance:

All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America.

Meeting Notice:

Meeting was properly posted at city hall and on the City of Muskego Web site as appropriate.

Minutes:

We reviewed the February 2019 meeting minutes. John Engelhardt motioned to approve the minutes, Mark Moriarty seconded. Minutes approved.

Treasurers Report

We reviewed the January checks which totaled \$2403.87. Mark Moriarty motioned to approve the checks and John Engelhardt seconded. The motion to pay the February checks was approved.

Lake District has total assets of \$853,601.55 at the end of January. Mark Moriarty motioned to approve the Treasurers Report. Patrick Moore seconded the motion. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

Old Business

SEWRPC/Lake Aquatic Plant Management Plan – with the attendance of John & Zoe, we discuss final edits to the report, so we have it finalized in the next couple of months. We specifically discussed adding more information about the extended drawdown so we captured when and how much and how it had some positive effects of weed management the following year. However, Heidi – from the DNR – is not ready to provide the results, so we cannot add a recommendation to the plan. However, we agreed that we wanted to note the timing and the events of the extended drawdown, so it was documented for future plans. We also asked to add information regarding our Lake Management Plan so we have both the management of the lake as well as plant management in the SEWRPC.

2019 Chemical Treatment Discussion –bid for partial treatment is expected to be around \$52K. A formal bid is still in process. The whole lake treatment is expected to be about \$150K. We have concerns from Big Silver Lake, who did a whole treatment, about the effectiveness over a three year period, which we documented in the February minutes. There is also a belief that there may still be residual effects of the extended drawdown that will benefit the lake during the summer of 2019, so

doing a whole lake treatment seems to not be in the best interest for the summer of 2019. Patrick made a motion – Steve Olson seconded - for a partial lake treatment and application as needed for the 2019 summer season. The motion passed.

New Business:

Ryan Wacholz asked about Fish Stocking because the ice fishing this year has been slower than previous years – DNR does the fish stocking each year, based on a survey of the lake. Some lakes have residents do supplemental stocking, but Little Muskego Lake has not done this in the recent past. Fay will contact the DNR to get a report on a recent survey to determine if there was a need for additional stocking this year.
