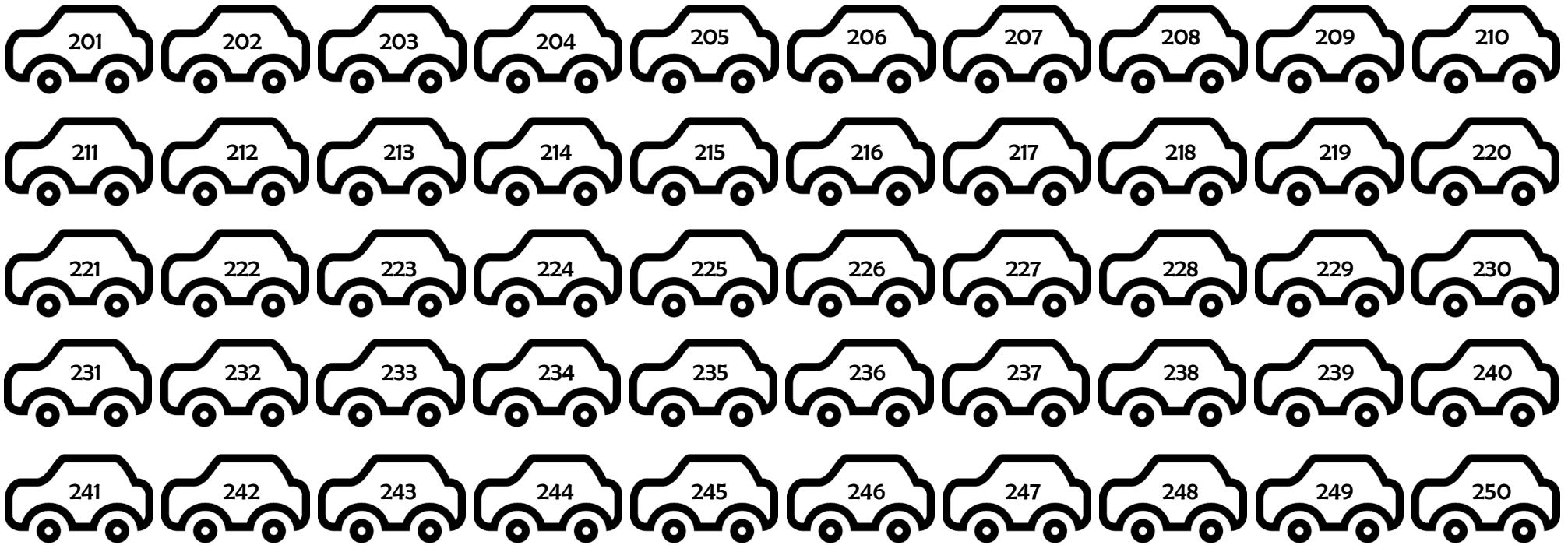




# Road to Reading

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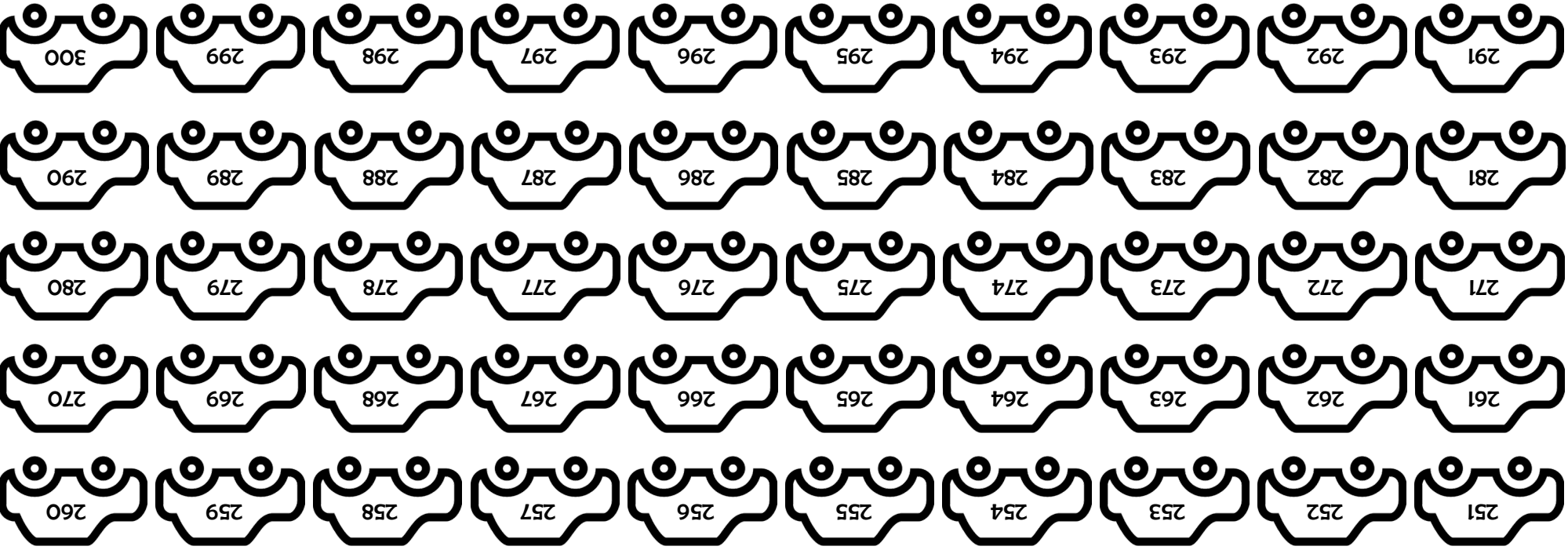

**Write...**

**Play...**  
 Alphabet I Spy. Look all around for the letters. Start with vowels and high-frequency letters, like S and T.
