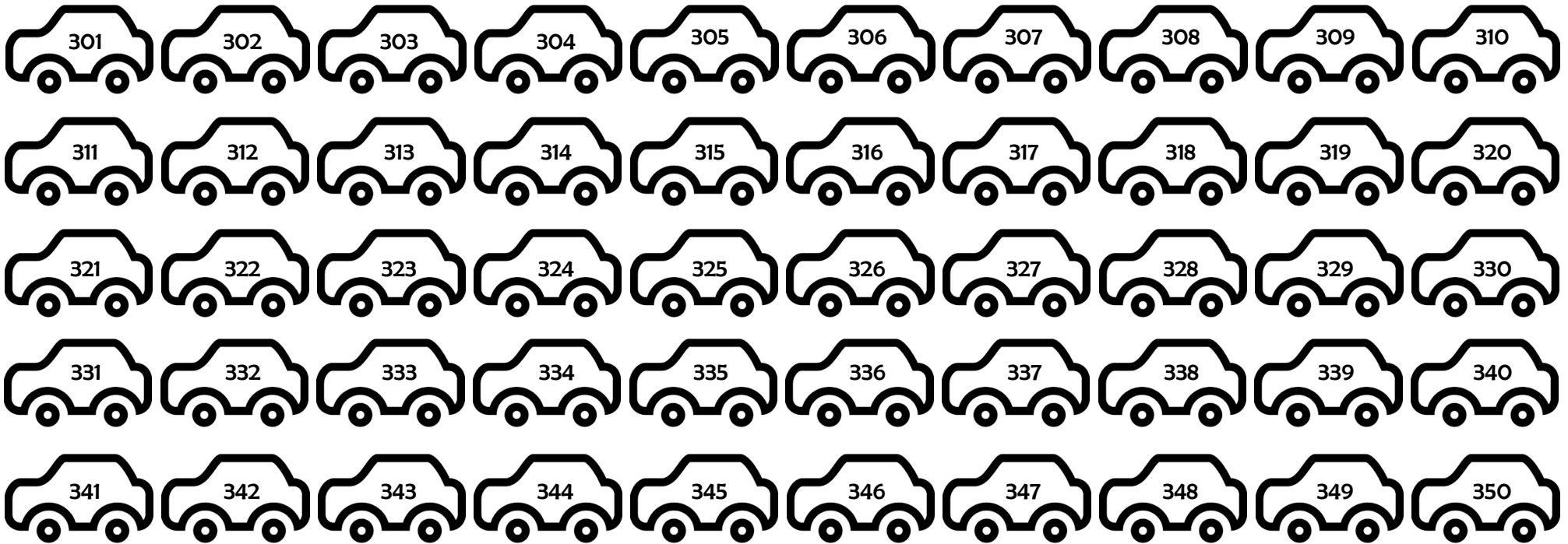




# Road to Reading

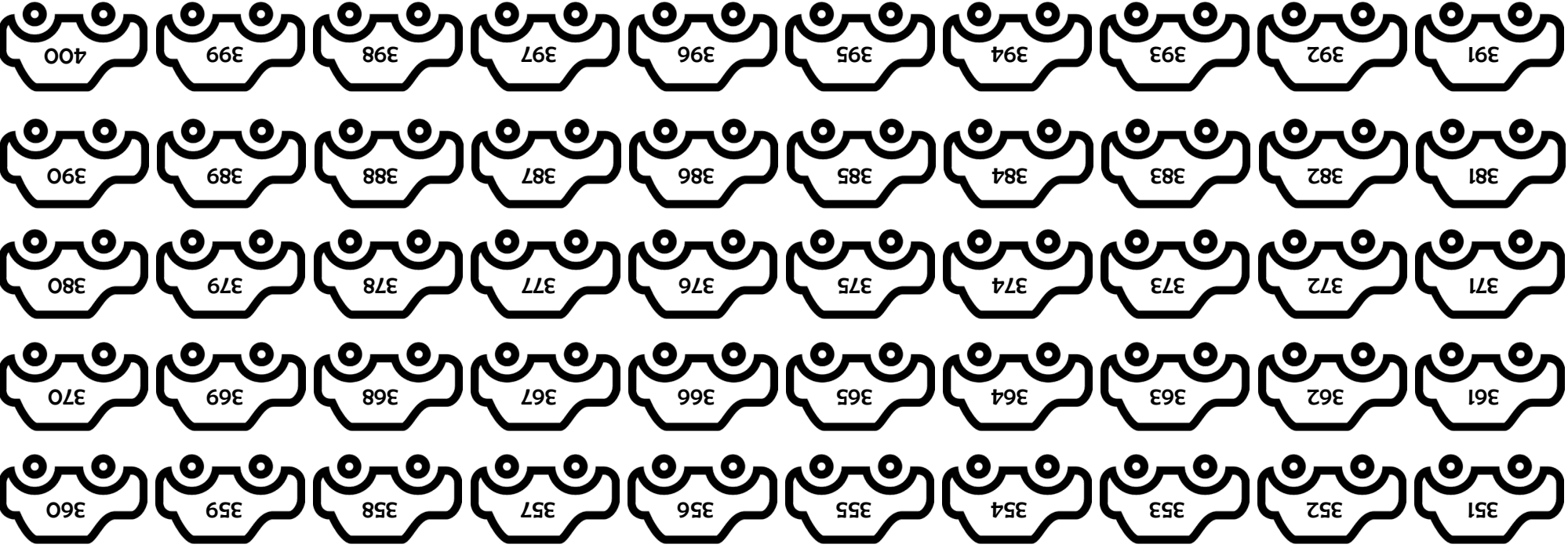
