



PROCLAMATION

To Lift the State of Emergency

Within the City of Muskego Regarding COVID-19

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, Kathy Chiaverotti, then acting Mayor, declared a State of Emergency in the City of Muskego pursuant to Chapter 323 of the Wisconsin State Statutes in light of the public health threat posed by COVID-19; and,

WHEREAS, on or about that same day, the City's Municipal Emergency Operations Plan went into effect and the City has operated under said plan ever since; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Emergency was declared due to the unknown aspects of the COVID-19 Pandemic, such as the potential for the overrun of the health care system and the speed at which transmission of the disease could occur; and,

WHEREAS, the fourteen day trend for emergency department visits for COVID-19 has been on a consistent downward trend and the metric categories such as COVID-19 symptoms, reported cases, and hospital capacity, are all in a green status; and,

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2020, Waukesha County Executive Paul Farrow, issued a set of recommendations for County residents and businesses, rather than orders, to assist them to safely conduct business and other activities moving forward while being mindful of CDC guidelines; and,

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2020 while continually monitoring the situation, Waukesha County Executive Paul Farrow, issued a release entitled "Stay Safe to Stay Open" Campaign as a unified approach to promote the actions businesses and residents may take to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in an effort to restart the economy and return to a more normal way of life; that the four concepts of the plan are to protect the vulnerable, stay home if sick, practice social distancing, and follow CDC best practices.

NOW THEREFORE, based upon the facts and circumstances as outlined above and that safe practices and guidelines are in place to limit the spread of COVID-19, I hereby lift the State of Emergency issued in the City of Muskego on March 18, 2020.
